Student Phone Information



Each dormitory room is equipped with one dual-line telephone. Each student will be assigned his/her private telephone number (example: 937-708-1234).

LOCAL CALLS

To make local calls using your dorm room phone, dial "9" then the seven digit number of the party you would like to talk with.

LONG DISTANCE CALLS

To make long distance calls using your dorm room phone, you will need a calling card – dial "9" and then follow your long distance calling card instructions.

ACCESSING VOICE MAIL

1. To access Voice Mail from the phone in your dorm room, press the button next to your extension, then press the MESSAGES BUTTON (the button with the envelope to the right of the down arrow). You will be prompted for your password. The default password is **336699**. You will be "walked through" your initial setup. When prompted to change your password, make it at least 4 digits and do not use consecutive numbers.

2. To access your voice mail from another phone on campus, dial 5210, when the recording comes on, press the * key, enter your ID which is the last 4 digits of your phone number, press #, then enter your password and press #.
3. To access your voice mail from an off-campus phone, dial 708-5210, when the recording comes on, press the * key, enter your ID which is the last 4 digits of your phone number, press #, then enter your password and press #.

WHEN YOU ARE IN YOUR VOICE MAIL:

1. To Hear New Messages, Press 1

A. Commands you can use during to a voice mail message:

- 1 – Repeat
- 2 – Save
- 3 – Delete
- 5 – Change volume
- 7 – Reverse
- 8 – Pause or Continue
- 9 – Fast-Forward

B. Commands you can use after a message:

- 3 – Delete
- 4 – Reply to another on-campus extension
- 5 – Forward Message to another on-campus extension
- 6 – Mark as New
- 9 – Hear Message Summary

2. To Send a Message: Press 2

3. To Review Old Messages: Press 3

4. For Setup Options: Press 4

5. Shortcuts

- 4 1 1 Change Greetings
- 4 2 3 Full or Brief Menus
- 4 3 1 Change Password
- 4 3 2 Change Recorded Name

6. Tips

- A. Cancel or Back Up: Press *
- B. Skip or Move Ahead: Press #
- C. Skip another user's greeting: Press #

MAILBOX LOCKOUT

For your own privacy, the voice mail system will lock your mailbox if the wrong password is used more than five times. To have your voice mail unlocked, you must present your WU I.D. card in person to the Secretary in the Information Technology Office in the basement of the Wolfe Building.
